- A. Livestock exhibitors are required to comply with all of the statutory and regulatory provisions of the State of Wisconsin relating to animal health. See the current animal health regulations in the front of this book.
- B. For base dates and class definitions see Section ATCP 160.08 of the State of Wisconsin Regulations in the front of this book.
- C. Junior Fair exhibitors may exhibit in Open Class, paying the appropriate fees, but MUST abide by the Open Class AGDA rules and will compete for ribbons. ADGA Rules shall govern.
- D. Judging will be held on Friday of Fair Week starting at 9:00 a.m.
- E. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- F. All goats must be permanently tattooed for identification and dehorned.
- G. All animals competing in the Junior Class for premiums must be in place in the pens no later than 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair. Goats will be released no earlier than 7:00 p.m. on Sunday. All goats must have USDA Scrapies Papers and WLIC Premise ID.
- H. Danish Judging System will be used for all classes.

1	Junior Doe Kid, 0 Months to under 6 Months
2	Junior Doe Kid, 6 Months to under 12 Months
3	Yearling Doe, 1 Year to under 24 Months
Above animals shall never have freshened	
4	Yearling Doe, 18 Months to under 24 Months
5	Senior Doe, 24 Months to under 36 Months
6	Senior Doe, 36 Months and older
Above animals must have freshened including dry milkers
